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and thinking up a number. It would have to come from a business point of view. If there wasn't a need for one in an area, I'm sure there wouldn't be any businessman that would be willing to risk a venture to put it in there. So you want to remember, this isn't something that, as you call it wide-open gambling, it isn't. It gives you a rational way of doing gambling in the state of Nebraska. As time comes on, you'll probably see it work out in such as the Iowa area, where they add casinos from time to time. They do studies to see how much...whether there's a chance for adding another casino into an area. You go in there. They always take your zip, your zip code or something like that. Some casinos gives you a little card and they keep track of that and amount of money you lose and where you're from and the whole thing. This is...this is done in a highly business way nowadays. With the computer system and everything that's going on, they know more about you when you spend your \$1.50 in a casino than you probably ever realized \$1.50 would buy them. So I think this is...this is an amendment that you surely...needs consideration. This is something that will help in the future. This would be something that would probably take us away from an ethanol-type fiasco, like we're going through now. This is something that wouldn't tie the hands of any future legislators that may want to do something worthwhile with the project. At the present time, when you put that two in there for a number, you're just fooling yourselves. It's something like, what do they say, whistling when you're going through the cemetery, and that's exactly what you'll be doing when you chisel these numbers in stone. This isn't anything that can ever do us...do you any good. It's going to be a problem all the way. And I guess, as Senator Chambers talks about Edgar Allan Poe and "The Raven," I guess the only thing I remember of that is whatever we do here will be the end of it and the raven says nevermore, nevermore. Thank you.
