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AM3567. Mr. President, that concludes my opening.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Schimek, do you wish to speak to this issue? We have some lights on up here from the previous...Senator Chambers, do you care to speak?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Preister a question, because his bill is intriguing. Senator Preister.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Yes, I will yield.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I see your bill is the "bipolar" steering committee, and I'm wondering if this is a service provided to people with that affliction, or do people with that affliction operate the committee?

SENATOR PREISTER: Senator Chambers, this time of the day and night I get bipolar and so it's a little difficult to understand some things.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Has anybody looked at this bill to see what it actually says? It might be something you want to keep. I'll ask Senator Byars a question.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Byars, will you yield?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Byars, are you familiar with the "bipolar" steering committee?

SENATOR BYARS: Yeah, I've been an ex-officio member for a long time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you're familiar with what this bill was going to do before Senator Bromm has asked us to do something else with it.
