out of the committee amendment and now we're just putting them back in, essentially. So there has been some give and there has been some take, and on much of it I have been doing the giving, and I accept that. There are some things that I would like to have still, but in the spirit of being cooperative and also in keeping my word, I'm going to go with the one amendment that will incorporate a number of these concepts, and we will get to those shortly. So at this point, I appreciate everyone working together, and am glad for that. And it is getting late and I know people would like to leave, but at the same time, this is very important and what we do is going to set a tone and is going to be what we live with. What we will end up with, I want to be clear to everybody, is not more stringent than we have. As you read through it, we're essentially doing less. We will ultimately be doing less than what we're doing right now. With that, Mr. Clerk, I will withdraw AM3191.
