Now it's 110 days, and that's to give more time for public comment input.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: And you're correct by stating it just went from 90 to 110 then?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I am.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. I was...I was concerned about that because I had in mind that it was a 30-day comment period, instead of 90-day. But I could be mistaken.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Ah...

SENATOR STUTHMAN: And I'm concerned about that.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Just if it would be the 30-day and going to the 110, but if it's been a 90-day and going to 110 then I don't have near the problems with it. But I am concerned, you know if it did more than triple.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Stuthman, if you're just talking about the comment period, the comment period is 30 days. It was 30 days before; it's 30 days in this bill.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: And that is the same.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is the same.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. What does the 110 days refer to?

SENATOR SCHROCK: The length of time it takes to issue the permit after it's been applied for.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay, that's the permitting process, when the permit...when the permit is given from the time it is applied for, right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct. That is if all the material
