SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. So the 30 days did stay the same then.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That was Senator Chambers' suggestion, and we don't think it changes the intent of the law any, so we don't think it's going to make it any more difficult for the producers.

SENATOR JONES: Okay. Well, I...that word makes a lot of difference sometime, and I just wanted your comment on it.

SENATOR SCHROCK: In some cases it does. In this cases we don't believe it's going to hinder the process.
