SENATOR RAIKES: And so operations that are not up to that standard now would have to get to that standard. Is that correct?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct, but, Senator, we are fortunate, we have had a good animal livestock waste program and so the facilities that are already operating shouldn't have any trouble meeting this requirement because it's what's been in law.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Stuthman, on AM?618.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Mr. President and members of the body. Senator Schrock, I would like to ask several questions of you, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, do you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: In the discussion before, I don't know if it was yours or it was Senator Preister's, but the nutrient management plan has to be updated yearly now? Is that correct?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Has to be filed annually. If there's no change, there won't have to be any change in the plan, but it has to be filed annually. If there's a change, then it has to be updated.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: What would you consider a change, if you're going to haul the nutrients to a different field or different parcel, or to another parcel, or if your whole nutrient plan has X amount of acres, immaterial of what it is that it will get placed on those acres?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Your nutrient management plan will have to be filed with NDEQ and if you vary or deviate from that, then you
