SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Senator Erdman, you mentioned the federal act. Do you happen to know what the title of that act is?

SENATOR ERDMAN:      The official title or the...

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN:      I do not, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      They use the term "unborn victim." They do not use the term "unborn child." Are you aware of that?

SENATOR ERDMAN:      I had heard that, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Okay. Thank you. Members of the Legislature, reference to the federal statute one way or the other is not going to alter my position. Some people who are fuzzy thinkers or nonthinkers have likened what would happen between me and Senator Foley today to an irresistible force meeting an immovable object, and I always have to explain that that is a contradictory proposition. It cannot happen. If a force is irresistible, that means nothing can stand in its way without being moved. So if you have an irresistible force, you cannot have an immovable object. If you take it from the other angle, if the object is immovable, that means nothing has the force, the energy, or the wherewithal to force it to shift its position. So either you will have an irresistible force or an immovable object, but you will not have both. And under the principles of physics, I am absolutely correct, but often verbal constructs produce notions that sound good and are alluring, but they are totally inconsistent, illogical, and impossible in the real world. That's why, when people make an appeal to what they call common sense, you wind up with what would have to be termed nonsense. When they talk about what seems intuitive, the more accurate position is described as counterintuitive. It simply means that much of what people believe or say they believe or think they believe is based on superstition, misinformation, false notions. That state of mind might be referred to as intuitive. You just have a feeling that this is the way it is.
