SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to debate me on many of these issues. But on the floor, if somebody is going to jump out there and make statements and we're debating, I will join the issue and participate. But many people do not really know enough to debate or try to interpret the things they present, but when you're dealing from a religious point of view you can be as ignorant as Job's turkey and it makes no difference, because people know you're just expressing your opinion that may have come to you in a dream that you thought was a vision in which God, whatever God you believe in, was talking to you. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, on the Chambers amendment. She waives her opportunity. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Let me continue the conversation a little bit and pick up on a couple of points that Senator Schimek made, because they are very important points. She's asking very legitimate and honest questions, and they need a good answer. They need a responsible answer. She raised this whole question of when a human being acquires a soul. This...and we all have different points of view on that. I have mine; you have yours. This bill does not require any of us to give ground on that question. It does not require any of us to reach a particular conclusion on that question. It's not even addressed in the bill. If you want to believe that a human person acquires a soul only at birth, or if you want to believe that a human person never acquires a soul, this bill doesn't disturb your point of view on that matter. That's a completely different question. That's not the question we're addressing in this bill, so let's set that aside. Senator Schimek raised
