SENATOR FRIEND: ...and help me understand it. Under...when did the substantive due process theory and idea, when was that developed? Was that with Roe v. Wade?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't...well, long before that. But why don't you just ask me the question that whoever gave you that wanted you to ask me.

SENATOR FRIEND: Okay. Well, thank you. Well, that was sort of a trick question because I think Roe v. Wade, my limited knowledge and I'll probably end up in a twisted mess after we're done with this, I think it's legislation. I think that law that these judges made is legislation.
