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stages of pregnancy, and when you said that, you were talking about that, the thought occurred to me, and your memory may be much sharper on this than mine. As I recall, there was a drug prescribed to women many years ago, I think it was called thalidomide. Is that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thalidomide, right.

SENATOR FOLEY: Do you remember that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR FOLEY: And there were some children born whose mother's had taken this drug legally, and the children suffered serious consequences.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Tremendous deformities, I don't remember, but I...it seems like it may have been a sleeping...they took it thinking it was a sleeping medication or something like that.

SENATOR FOLEY: Something, yeah, something like that, yeah. Let's just suppose, hypothetically, that someone with malicious intent spiked a pregnant woman's food or drink with a drug like that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Uh-huh.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...in the earliest stages of her pregnancy. He did it deliberately because he knew she was pregnant and he deliberately spiked her food or drink with either that drug or some similar drug.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That would result in a deformed child, so that's the point you're getting to,...

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that that's what would be the result.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes.
