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you just ask me what you want to ask me?

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I have been asking you what I want to ask you, but to further this along, I think that it is possible for a person to inflict serious bodily injury even at the earliest stages of pregnancy through chemical means. That's the core point I'm trying to make here, because I'm...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so you're expressing an opinion that you have of how that could happen.

SENATOR FOLEY: I'm sorry?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, you're expressing an opinion of how that could happen, that a chemical means could be utilized that would affect the fetus at a very early stage of development.

SENATOR FOLEY: And has consequences for the child for the rest of his or her life.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you don't know that until the child is born.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's quite possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that's when the charge would be brought.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's quite possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you can't establish after birth at what point precisely that substance was administered.

SENATOR FOLEY: If the prosecutor could prove beyond a reasonable doubt when this chemical substance were...was ingested by the mother...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's impossible. Even medical testimony could not prove exactly when it had been administered,...
