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gets you there. Again, I hope that's responsive to your question, Senator Beutler. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler and Senator Foley. Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President, and this is the time of year when different procedures and extraordinary agreements can be made and must be made in order to facilitate doing as much business as is reasonably possible or prudent to do. And I think what we have is reached some sort of an accord that I will describe, and then I'd like to ask Senator Foley and Senator Chambers whether they are agreeable to this; and that would be that this bill, which has had some debate now but which may or may not be ready for closure; that's a subjective standard we've had some tradition in the past of going X number of hours which isn't cast in stone but which is probably...there's some merit certainly in having some considerable time spent on bills, especially on General File, if they are significant bills, and I think most of the senator priority bills and certainly this one is a significant bill. So this is what I think has been suggested and agreed to, that Senator Chambers pull all of his amendments and that anyone else who has an amendment on the bill pull their amendments, and that we take a vote on the advancement of the bill. Providing the bill advances, it would, of course, be on Select File but it would be behind everything else and I have the schedule for Tuesday which includes some pretty significant Select File stuff, includes some extensive Final Reading that we must do, and that bill is going to fall behind what I think we need to do on Tuesday. So, as Senator Foley said to me, it would take some divine intervention for that bill to have time and certainly for it to have significant time to have another significant debate and have closure or something approaching closure, that is very unlikely, and I've so advised Senator Foley. If we do this and vote on the bill, then we would move to a couple of other bills on the agenda. Senator Combs has wanted to have some brief discussion on her bill and certainly we'd like to accommodate that. I don't think she feels that she needs to spend a great deal of time on it, and she's represented that. Senator Synowiecki I think feels the same about his bill. Then we have two bills, LB 850,
