SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Speaker Bromm. The motion before the body is to adjourn...motion before the body is to adjourn sine die. Roll call vote has been requested. Call of the house has been requested. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed nay.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM: We are under call. Members, please record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused members please return to the floor and record your presence. Senator Maxwell, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MAXWELL: I'm...I just want to know for myself, what is the vote total needed for this motion to carry? Majority? Simple majority?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Maxwell, thank you for the question. It's a simple majority of those voting.

SENATOR MAXWELL: Of those voting. Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Kruse, Senator Loudon. All unexcused members have recorded their presence. I believe there was a request for a roll call vote, if I'm not mistaken, in regular order. And, members, the motion that you're voting on is the motion to adjourn sine die, and that would require a majority of those voting. Please call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1566-1567.) The vote is 3 ayes, 38 nays on the motion to adjourn sine die, Mr. President.
