on line that we do not anticipate, we're going to have to have some money somewhere, and we do have some time now for several years. So with that, I'll conclude. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. Senator Beutler, could I carry on a little conversation with you so I have the facts straight here on your amendment?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You bet.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah, Senator Beutler, the way I'm looking at this chart, the 2.5 cent, it would be an increase on the fuel, off-road fuel tax. Right?

SENATOR BEUTLER: It would be an increase in the extent...to the extent that it's extended in the out years. It doesn't increase the rate.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. It does not raise? That's where it's at now and it would just extend it out to the year 2010 and '11. It that right?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. And now...but the checkoff, you're raising that a quarter of a cent...

SENATOR BEUTLER: No.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...or is that staying the same also?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The checkoff rate doesn't increase either. It's...the rate that currently applies is simply extended out in FY '11 and '12 for one year. No rates are increased anywhere.
