good business plan, it makes sense in terms of indicating the actual cost of this program and how you come up with enough money to pay for it. But then I also hear, well, we're really not ready to make those decisions though now. We should just wait, and I don't know if implied in that is maybe a miracle will happen, or I think...I think actually the more likely or what I'm hearing is a more likely scenario is that, well, maybe a disaster of some sort will happen, in the sense...a disaster in the sense we'll have a much greater financial obligation because more plants are able to qualify for these very rich incentives. Again, I think it just makes good sense for us to take this one step at a time, to make it clear to the public what it is it's going to take to fund what we have already committed ourselves to. And I think that what Senator Baker says I would agree with. I think that there's a virtual certainty of four plants and that's all we're dealing with here. We're not reaching out and saying, well, gosh, suppose we get an additional two plants two plants or an additional five plants, then we need to...we need to make contingency for funding all those additional plants. We're not...or Senator Beutler's amendment does not do that at all. All it says is, for the best of circumstances, given the financial obligations that we're going to incur, what do we need to do? And let's get that much in place now. Again, I don't see why that is not something that we should do. Again, I strongly urge you to consider this very carefully. And if you believe that it is good policy to let people know what the financial obligations are, and to make it clear that this is not...I don't disagree with the argument that this is...this is likely not the end of this sorry scenario, but at least it covers us as far as we know it's going to go now. And I think that's only a prudent thing to do. So again, I would urge the adoption of the Beutler amendment. Thank you.
