Let me tell you, their profit margin is so close right now. Right now, yes, we're having some higher prices. But if you'll watch the market, it's continually dropping every day, from 6 to 7 cents. I've worked on the compromise so that we could move forward on this bill. And now I'm sorry that I did in the fact that the burden is going more on agriculture all of the time. So I'm going to oppose the Beutler motion. It's not going to make us whole anyway and I hope that you'll do the same. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. All in favor of ceasing debate please vote aye, and opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BROMM: Debate does cease. Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close on the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Let me call the house right off, Senator Bromm, if I may, and I'd ask for a roll call vote in regular order, but I would preserve my closing time here.

SPEAKER BROMM: All in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, opposed nay. Record please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Beutler, you're welcome to proceed with your closing, if you'd like.
