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year. And the basic idea of the bill was to create a distinct grouping of people within government, with an administrator at their head with responsibility for one very important thing and nothing else, and that one responsibility was the maintenance, preservation and restoration of the State Capitol Building and the State Capitol grounds. And you may recall last year we discussed this bill on General File, on Select File, and it passed over to Final Reading, notwithstanding continual opposition from the Governor's Office. At that point in time, there was agreement that it would be held, and that over the interim and during this current session we would work together and use that as a time for rethinking of the Governor's objections by both the Governor's Office and by the proponents of this particular bill. And I want to stop right now and thank a number of people for getting this amendment together. Senator Engel and Senator Schimek and Senator Chambers and Senator Hudkins have been involved in this from the beginning and right along, and this amendment is by no means my amendment. It is a selection of ideas from those various senators. And having said that, I want to also say that the Governor's Office was tremendously cooperative. There was some tough negotiating sessions, but they...they worked in good faith. They worked and compromised, and I wish to thank Lauren Hill and the people in the Governor's Policy Research Office and others who worked on it, and I do believe that at this point in time the Governor's Office and all of the senators involved are all in agreement on this amendment, and it does...it is truly a compromise. It takes and gives from everybody's perfect world. The Governor, last year I think, and I hope I'm being fair here, basically had three main types of objections. First of all, he didn't want to create additional expense, and the bill, as it went over on Final Reading last year, created someplace between \$60,000 and \$120,000 of additional expense. So we worked on that and the amendment that's before you now will not require any additional General Fund expense. The Governor suggested that we use DAS services for certain things. The senators suggested that, okay, but the Capitol administrator still would be making the final decisions on these matters, and that was agreeable. So we've divided out the personnel who...from DAS who will be involved in the Capitol Administrator's Office, but we have not added to it and we have not created any General...any additional General
