Fund expense. So that item got worked out. The Governor disliked the new Capitol space allocation formula. It was a formula that, quite frankly, was more favorable to the legislative branch of government. We actually compromised that out by simply returning to what current law is with regard to space allocation in the Capitol. There is now no change in that...in that particular area. Thirdly, the Governor's Office felt that the bill that was on Final Reading last year was incomplete in terms of all of the different kinds of statutory revisions that would be necessary to draw a clear line between the responsibilities in the Capitol Environs area as between DAS and as between the new Capitol administrator. So we've worked long, and several "back and forths" on who's doing what, when, and where, and I think we have all of that in order to the satisfaction of the administrators in the executive branch of government. So what the bill does is to create the Office of the State Capitol Administrator. The State Capitol Commission advises that administrator in various respects, but that administrator is appointed by the Governor and operates as an employee of the Governor. That administrator hires and fires the people under him or her to deal with the Capitol Building and the Capitol grounds. It doesn't include the Governor's Office or any other areas, other than the Capitol Building and the Capitol grounds. The new office has responsibility for the entire operations of the Capitol, except security and parking. Those were two complicated areas that required some negotiation, and Senator Hudkins was...her original bill was...originally focused on security and who would control that, but that's been worked out to everybody's satisfaction. The space needs of the Legislature are determined by the Legislature and after that then determined by the State Capitol Administrator in accordance with the agreement. With respect to DAS responsibility, basically the responsibility of DAS is found at the bottom of page 2 of the amendment, on the bottom half of the page, and that states, I think clearly, what they are expected to do. The Capitol Commission, for your information, will consist of the Governor, the Speaker of the Legislature, the State Court Administrator. That's a change. Senator Brashear had a bill that he had brought pursuant to the request of the Supreme Court indicating that the Chief Justice did not feel comfortable, for a variety of...for a variety of reasons, being on the State
