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is...says a lot about your willingness to work with everybody on it. I'm wondering, at some point maybe we'll find out what happens to that security issue, because I honestly don't know. But at any rate, I just want to thank Senator Beutler, say I think this is a good step forward, and it will be I think a much better way of administering the Capitol, of which we are all so proud.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I think this is probably something we need to consider, the security of our buildings and structure and that sort of thing of the State Capitol, because it is the center of government. I'd like to ask Senator Beutler questions, if he would yield, please.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler, would you yield, please?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Senator Beutler, does this...does this include the Historical Society Building down there? Is it included in this? Because when I read on page 20, I don't see where it's deleted from here. So who takes care of the security of the Historical Society?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, let me...let me get the answer for that...on that for you, because right at this second I need to jog my memory a little bit. But let me tell you this, that there was a specific request from the Historical Society with regard to security, and we asked DAS and the Governor's Office to take a look at that, because we wanted to do whatever it was they wanted to do on that particular issue. It wasn't a legislative issue with respect to any of the senators that were involved. So what's in the bill, whatever it is, is what DAS recommended that we do, and let me get back to you on exactly what that is.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. And then over on page 21 of that, you know, the Nebraska State Patrol shall consult with the Governor
