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SENATOR RAIKES: Yes, it is, Senator. There's a sunset provision in there, July 1 of 2005, and it's there for the express purpose of ensuring that this would be examined next session.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. I just wanted to bring your attention to some language that indicates that the individual is exempted if they are, one, designated and, two, trained by the school district. And I assume it's your intent that a person who's designated but may not be adequately trained or trained at all, through the omission of the school district or the educational service union...unit or whoever they're working for, as designated in this statute, that you're not intending that any individual would be allowed to be sued under...either under this or any related law because they happen to be designated and didn't...and unknowingly didn't get the requisite training that was...that is otherwise apparently required. Would that be accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, it would be. The liability does not cover someone that is under the influence, impaired by alcohol or something like that. I would tell you that the intent of this is that the school district involved would, coincidence...coincident with designating a person, provide training. So...and I realize the issue of adequate training. I don't know how to define that exactly, but I think...I think the designation should be along with training. Someone should not be asked to perform this service without the benefit of training. And if they...if they are designated and trained and perform this service, then they would be immune. There's some complicated law here that I don't understand, I will readily admit that, in dealing with the good Samaritan law and when that might apply, or when certain other provisions of liability limitation may or may not apply, which again is why I think this should be viewed as a temporary measure to carry us forward to next session when it can...when the issue can be dealt with more completely.
