SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. I'm just scanning 1601, and each subsection starts with, all private, denominational, or parochial schools shall either comply with. Each section sets out those three institutions. And again, I'm not against what you're trying to do. I'm just not certain that your language accomplishes that. I'm struggling as to what to do, Senator Redfield, because I'm not sure that your language is quite right. Maybe if Senator Raikes would yield to a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Raikes, did you hear my exchange with Senator Redfield?

SENATOR RAIKES: I did, Senator.

SENATOR BOURNE: And again, I'm new to the Education Committee, but this is the first that I've heard of it, and I certainly support what Senator Redfield is trying to do. But have you looked at this language at all?

SENATOR RAIKES: Just in the last four or five minutes, Senator.

SENATOR BOURNE: Hold on a second, Senator Raikes. We heard Senator Redfield, in her opening, say that Russ Inbody with the State Department of Education brought this to her. Has he discussed this with you?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, not with me, Senator.

SENATOR BOURNE: Actually, I'm going to yield the remainder of my time to Senator Raikes and, hopefully, as the Chair of the Education Committee, he could provide some guidance to us. I'm curious as to how the Department of Education would bring an amendment and not talk to the Chair of the Education Committee so that we could know that this language is accurate. But with that, I'll yield my time to Senator Raikes.
