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SENATOR BRASHEAR: You voted for the more expansive version, as did I. We've now negotiated it to a more restrictive version.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's right. And I...since casting that vote, I've looked at this a little bit further. And maybe I'm just not understanding it fully. But...so let's explore this a little bit. Must the actual assault have occurred in a home, in the home of the victim?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I need to get the language in front of me, Senator Foley. Your question again, please?

SENATOR FOLEY: I'm wondering if the...in our definition of domestic assault, if we're requiring that the act in question must have occurred in the home of the victim. I...and the reason I ask this, when I see the term "domestic assault," that's kind of what I think of as a layman, that this is a fight between family members within the home. But I'm not sure the language really speaks of it in those terms.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I'm getting everything except what I want. If you'll give me a...

SENATOR FOLEY: Why don't I...sure. Why don't I ask Senator Mossey, because he may have...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Let me check with counsel.

SENATOR FOLEY: Would Senator Mossey yield?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Mossey, would you respond?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Yes.

SENATOR FOLEY: Same question, Senator Mossey. Are we talking about acts of violence that occur within the home?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Domestic violence can happen anywhere. It doesn't necessarily...

SENATOR FOLEY: So it could...
