SENATOR MOSSEY: It doesn't have to happen in the home.

SENATOR FOLEY: Does not...okay, fine. And I don't think it necessarily relates to family members. For example, father-son situation. Suppose father and son share a home and they get into a fight.

SENATOR MOSSEY: That would be a standard assault. That's not an actual...

SENATOR FOLEY: That's not a domestic assault.

SENATOR MOSSEY: No, that's not a relationship that involves...I'm trying to phrase it for you, but, intimacy, you know, dating, things like that.

SENATOR FOLEY: Right. Right.

SENATOR MOSSEY: That's not a relationship of that sort.

SENATOR FOLEY: But I'm wondering why we wouldn't want to include father-son fights and family fights in general.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Because domestic violence occurs between two people in an intimate relationship. A father and a son is a separate relationship. When it comes to domestic violence, it's between...

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, it's a different relationship, but it's within the family, and it just seems to me that...

SENATOR MOSSEY: Correct. That would be like if two brothers got in a fight.

SENATOR FOLEY: Exactly. Exactly.

SENATOR MOSSEY: That is not a domestic, as defined. Domestic is between two people that have a relationship of intimacy.
