Reading to Select File for Senator Mossey's amendment. I'd appreciate your support.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Open for discussion on the motion to return. Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Let me touch on, just briefly a little bit, about what this bill does, once again. It creates the crime of domestic assault in the first, second, and third degree. On the second offense on the same person, there's enhanced penalties. So if you had, for example, third-degree domestic assault, which is the lowest of penalties, that's a Class I misdemeanor. On your second offense, that would then become a felony. It would also require all domestic assaults a presentence investigation. We also clarified sections in there to where...to strike a section about granting immunity when firearms are seized, also the section regarding the subpoenaing of tape recordings. Along with that, in the original committee amendment there's also sections in there that require all law enforcement agencies, by July of 2005, to adopt a written domestic violence policy, which I think is very important to address domestic violence. And something else that's not in the domestic violence section that we added to other portions are, it establishes a dating relationship. For example, that case in Detroit I just cited, those were two people that were dating, where he murdered his girlfriend and the four children. It also, along with dating relationships, I believe that was...oh, also sexual assault on your spouse. A lot of people believe that you cannot sexually assault your spouse, but that is incorrect. You can sexually assault your spouse, and it creates that. If you were to rape your spouse, that is also covered under the domestic violence laws. With that, I will ask for the return to Select File for this...for AM3663. Thank you.
