tracking this language, for some reason they left out the word final. Under the existing law, copies are not made available. They have access right now to this information. Here is what, under the law, they get right now. And Senator Brown is talking about these big operations. "The commission shall, not later than"--and I'm reading from page 2, starting in line 18, original language in the law, and I'm not going to read the new language. "The commission shall, not later than ten days after such filing or the identification of an additional respondent under subsection (2) of this section, serve on the respondent"--this is what must be served--"a notice identifying the alleged discriminatory housing practice, advising such respondent of the procedural rights and obligations of respondents under the act, together with a copy of the original complaint." So they get, based on the law, an identification of the alleged discriminatory housing practice, notification of procedural rights and obligations, and a copy of the original complaint, so they know what it is that they're dealing with. This is a situation where, I imagine, if you could wave around a copy of an original complaint...I meant, not the complaint, but an investigative report, not the final report, but while the investigation is open and ongoing, there is an advantage that an accused operator would have. As pointed out in that letter, whether Senator Brown likes the author of the letter or not, there is no other agency required to make records available or investigations available while the investigation is ongoing. HUD does not do that itself. They want copies of this investigative report. That is not what ought to be forthcoming. And I'm not bound by the foolishness or errors of people who operate agencies. I have often on this floor disagreed with comments made by the heads of agencies, whether it's a judge, the Attorney General, the head of HHS. If they are not cognizant of what the consequences are of their actions, I'm not bound by an inappropriate position that they take. I did ask for additional information from a man in whom I do have confidence. And the documentation mentioned in his letter accompanies it. You can look at those statements that HUD gave relative to the kind of information they do not allow to be given. Ongoing investigations do not provide information to accused entities or individuals. So to give copies of that investigative report...
