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after that person, the apartment is rented to that person or offered to that person. If she tells me that does not occur, I will not say another word on this bill, because that will mean the people in this body are so blind and irrational that there's no need in me wasting any of my time. I've said enough already to outline the problem. When it comes to the house, not just the apartment, if she'll stand up and tell you all that it does not happen that a minority group member will go to rent a house or lease it that is listed on the market as being for rent and be turned away, then a white person will come right behind that person and be offered the lease, if she tells me that does not occur, I will sit down. If it comes to the sale of a house that's on the market and a minority group member goes to buy the house and is told that the house has already been sold, then a white person comes immediately after that person and the person is told the house is on the market and negotiations can be entered, if she tells me that doesn't happen, then I'll sit down and not say another word. And that's what I'm looking for her to say when her opportunity to speak comes around. Now if she acknowledges that those things do happen, and that these testing organizations have established that it happens, why do you want to be in league with these realtors who conduct themselves and their business in that manner? And here's how they get white people. When they decide that they want to open an area--because they can lease to us at exorbitant rates. Some of us live in housing that is so pathetically uninhabitable, but the rents are so high. The realtors decide when they're going to bust up a neighborhood. They will let a black person in, and white people take flight. And then these apartments, or houses, as the case may be, will be made available to black people, and advertisements will be put in publications read by black people and in the black community, because the houses will be sold much more, at a much higher price, to those black people who are bordering on desperation than any white person would pay for it. Because they're trying to escape from something, not just go to something. The same way with the cost of the rent. It can be jacked up. These are realities that you all don't confront, so you really don't care. And I shouldn't be surprised, because that's not an uncommon attitude across this country. And it's why organizations like the NAACP don't go out of business. It's why states put in place an NEOC. But really, the state put it
