I lived in Bellevue a number of years ago when, through some sort of quirk, they did local option gaming, slot machines, anywhere alcohol was sold for consumption; well, actually, anywhere alcohol was sold. And there were places that we would go out to dinner that it was just...it was so pervasive. You couldn't go many places and not see it. And there would be children often playing the slots because there wasn't a whole lot of enforcement. That's the other piece of why I'm so very afraid of the petitions and that potential, and at least when you have it confined there is a way for us to regulate it and do enforcement. I know if I opened this issue Senator Smith will probably respond to it about my having heard from my hairdresser who's a new person, I've never had her before, who had a...was a problem gambler, and she talked about it and so I ask her...she had no idea who I was...I asked her what she thought about the petitions and the proposal before us, and this was last year. And her response was that she was terrified of the petitions because she knew that she couldn't control herself if it was there all the time, but if she had to make a decision to go to a casino,...

SENATOR MAXWELL: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...it was her decision. It was a conscious decision. Sometimes she made the wrong decision, but she knew where that decision point was. And I went to the casinos with some of the other members of the Legislature and not only was it a confined area, but they carded us. Now, one...and some of the people who went along were not even partaking of gambling and they probably didn't appreciate the carding. I actually thought it was quite wonderful. But it did reinforce that in a casino there is a structure that is going to be somewhat protective of society if we construct it, if we construct...and I mean...
