SENATOR FOLEY: So he couldn't prosecute under the existing assault statute...

SENATOR MOSSEY: No, this...

SENATOR FOLEY: ...if this passes.

SENATOR MOSSEY: ...this law is replacing that and creating offensive domestic assault. So anybody that has a relationship together like we talked about earlier would fall under the domestic assault law.

SENATOR FOLEY: Okay. So the assault statute is repealed and we're replacing it with this. Okay. Well, I don't want to prolong this. I do think there is some ambiguity here. However, I will say that, Senator Mossey, we did--you and I sit together on the Judiciary Committee--there was a fair amount of testimony in support of the concept of a domestic assault statute, and I tend to agree that we need a domestic assault statute. The testifiers weren't necessarily looking at this language, because this is relatively new language. But I applaud your work. I think what I'm going to do is just simply not vote, and leave it at that. So thank you, Senator Mossey. Mr. President, are there any other lights on at this point?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley, there is. Senator Bourne's light is on.

SENATOR FOLEY: And I think I see him turn...

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. He just took it off, if...

SENATOR FOLEY: If there are no lights on, Mr. President, I will pull the motion. If there are lights on, then I'll let those senators speak.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion is withdrawn.

SENATOR FOLEY: All right. Thank you.
