SENATOR JONES: Thank you, Carol, and for all them comments. I'm going to miss this place too, but before I get any farther, I want to do some thanking, because I don't want to leave that till last and then forget it. But I'd like to thank my wife first, Pat, she's sitting back here, simply because she just put up with me for all these 12 years, keeping two houses, one here in Lincoln and one at home, and wondering if she's got the right clothes here and the right clothes there. We always kid each other about sour milk here or sour milk there, you know, when we're traveling back and forth. But it has been a great run and I really appreciate this group. I know that I'll miss all the friends here mostly, and I have tried my best to represent agriculture.
