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there is not a dentist, I can see that part of it being very But the concern of mine is if there's an area that valuable. needs a dentist and it's an underserved area for low-income people, and he comes in for three months and leaves, what's going to happen after that? Is there going to be another dentist come in from another state, work for three months, and then after that's done another one? Or is there going to be a that's going to be employed by the...in that underserviced area? The concerns of mine are who is going to be liable, who's going to be responsible, you know, after this dentist leaves that area and goes back to his state? Is that individual going to be liable if there's been a dental practice has not really been acceptable and the next three months there's a lot of toothaches, a lot of problems with what the dentist has done the prior three months? That's very much a concern of mine. Is the Dental Association going to be liable for this, or is the dentist going to be liable for this, or what is going to happen? Or is the community health department that has established these dentist chairs in their community, are they going to be liable for that? So I'm a little bit concerned I do support the bill as far as providing dental with that. service in an underserviced area. That is not my concern, my concern is, you know, these people coming in for three months and leaving, you know, maybe never coming back. You know, is there going to be any liability that's going to be upon the state or upon that dentist? So that is my concern. I'll return the balance of my time to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Chambers, on advancement of LB 89.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Arnie and Ernie are at it again. This man who sits in front of me must read my mind, or he's transmitting his thoughts into my mind. I was going to draft an amendment that would say any person who suffers harm or damage as a result of the activities of a person granted this temporary right to practice shall be able to recover from the state of Nebraska. And I'd like to ask Senator Byars a question or two.
