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SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Janssen, would you care to use Senator Schimek's time?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Do you want the rest of my time? Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, thank you. Thank you, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR LANDIS: About a minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Do we...well, that's fine. I've got my light on. I don't know whether I'm next or not. We tend to forget that we're talking about where the Guard and reserves are at now. The Army Reserve cannot...you cannot use them within the state, but I want to remind you that the Nebraska National Guard is used in this state when we have emergencies, such as storms, disasters that happen in the state. They are at the will of the Governor. The Governor can activate that Guard within the state where they can't use the federal troops. So, not only are the Guard being deployed overseas right now, but they are and can be...in past times the Governor has called them up for disasters within this state. I remember when there were tornadoes, bad snowstorms and so on, roads needed to be cleared, they activated the Guard for those types of situations. So I just want to remind you that the Guard, also the Air Guard, you know, can be deployed also within the state. So that's something that I want you to keep in mind. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Janssen. There is an amendment on the desk from Senator Chambers. We'll move to it in just a moment, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Chambers, yours is an amendment to the committee amendment, and you are recognized for ten minutes. (FA7, Legislative Journal page 414.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, this amendment would strike the words "four hundred thousand" from the committee amendment. Senator Janssen, I'd like to ask you a question.
