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Rommel was not a Nazi. Black people were made to fight in the army of South Africa, too, while there was apartheid, and they were captured by the Germans, along with white South African And the white South Africans told Rommel, we will not be quartered in the same building with these black men; that's not how it's done in South Africa. And you know what Rommel said, who came from a country with a Nazi regime, where they believed in superiority of the Aryan race? Rommel said, you're all in the same army together, you all wear the same uniform of that army, you were all taken captives as members of that army and you will be held in captivity, or prison, as members of the same army; there will be no segregation. So these black men were given more recognition for their humanity by the Germans than by the country which had impressed them into service, and the same thing for black men. A lot of white people don't even realize there were prisoners of war in this country, Germans and Italian, Nazis, fascists, and there were black men who were quarding these prisoners of war. And when they were in the South, the fascists and the Nazis could eat in restaurants, and black men were not allowed to go into the restaurants, in the U.S. uniform, guarding prisoners of war, whose countries were fighting to destroy this country. We saw that. Our ancestors saw it. Our relatives saw it. That's why my eyes are jaundiced and I don't see America the way you all see it. And I see a great waste of life in Iraq going on now, and it will go on for a period of time that nobody can estimate. When they captured Saddam, I had said, and I wrote it down and the World-Herald published it because I wanted a record of it, that Saddam is old news; capturing him means nothing; there will be more violence after his capture than there was before. And that's what came to pass. Am I a seer, s-e-e-r, a fortuneteller? Can I see the future? No, but I can...I've read history. I can see trends, and I will tell a truth that other people are aware of but they won't speak it. Who even thinks about Saddam now? After no weapons of mass destruction were found, and that was before Christmas, all those people stopped looking. Ιt announced till a few days ago in January, died not with a whimper but with a whisper. And the reason for going to war was wiped away and Americans just go along and accept it. Why would Saddam be considered a threat of any kind? They said he killed his own people, so he had to go. Bush knows that over a
