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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. Go ahead.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The 100 percent would still stay in the bill. It's how much you fund...how much money you put into the kitty that determines how many people would get funded. The money would still say the same.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. So I'm willing to take it a step at a time and we will take Senator Brown's amendment, which removes all of this money from the bill, because that dollar amount should have never been put in the statute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Probably not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And then we can focus on whether it ought to go from 75 percent to 100 percent.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That would then become the argument on this bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. I thank you for that. And I hope everybody understands the little discussion that we just had. Rather than having any money amounts in the bill, what we would like to do is defeat the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But then we also have to have a follow-up amendment which takes the \$900,000 out of the bill, and we will come back another time to decide how much. And I think...I think we do need some further discussion on the federal programs before we decide, if we are going to decide, to go to this \$1.4 million. I'm perfectly willing, and I'm sure Senator Janssen is too, to have that discussion, because if there are federal funds available and we're not making full use of them because we're doing state funding, well, we should examine our heads a bit. So, with that, I would just simply ask the body to vote for Senator Chambers'...no. Senator Chambers, you will
