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have to withdraw your amendment and then we will ask to have the committee amendment either amended or defeated. So, with that, Mr. President, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Louden, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. As I've listened to the debate and the discussion and the lesson in decorum, I guess I've come up with some questions that kind of concerns me. And, Mr. President, may I ask Senator Janssen a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, are you available for a question from Senator Louden?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Well, as I look through this bill, Senator Janssen, do I read this correctly that this money has to be spent on Nebraska community colleges or universities or something like that? Is this...this tuition money to be spent in state?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Then, if I read this, my understanding would be then whatever money that is given to these National Guard people would actually go back into our own colleges and universities in our state.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, any state...any state college or university or community college, anything that is a state-operated school.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Right. So, really then, we're actually recycling our own money. Am I correct at that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's exactly right, Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: And we're helping do business right at home
