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with our own colleges and universities and trade schools or whatever.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah, it would be no parochial school, only...or private school, only a state school.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Well, my observation is, is I think the thing looks pretty good the way it is, so I don't know whether it needs amendments or not. The difference went from 75 to 100 percent of funding in the bill so there probably with the amendment they were raising the cap, if that has to be raised. I don't know if the cap has been reached yet or if that's what it takes to reach a cap. With that, I would...I would return any time I have to Senator Janssen, if he so desires it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, would you care to use the rest or remainder of Senator Louden's time?

SENATOR LOUDEN: Sure. I'll use a few minutes of it, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: About two and a half minutes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you. Know, we are...this is what I think is really the biggest part of the bill, is that it has to be used at any community college, any state college or university. We do keep the money in Nebraska. You're right, Senator Louden, that is the way it works, and I think other states are the same way. Other states are at 100 percent that surround us. All the states that surround us are at 100 percent and theirs is written the same way. It has to stay within that...within those state schools. So thank you for joining in the debate and I hope your questions have been answered.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden and Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers, and this will be your...is Senator Chambers available? Senator Chambers, did you wish to...you're allowed to speak from that mike.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. It is so refreshing to have a "nontyrant" in the Chair. However, as I've
