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first "of" in the sentence. So I just want to...I'm just rising to clarify so that, on page 2, it's a credit of up to 100 percent. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Thank you, Senator Thompson.    Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Janssen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I can understand Senator Schimek's feeling about the National Guard. Her feelings are not my feelings. When a young black man with the Nebraska National Guard went down south, and they put a rope around his neck, threw it over a tree, and there were people talking Ku Klux Klan stuff, from Mississippi, and hooked it to a truck, and pulled him off the ground, or a group of them pulled him off the ground, nevertheless, he was pulled off the ground by the National Guard, I had to take on the job of getting something done about it in this state. Nobody was doing anything. No senator spoke about it, not one. And the young man was so traumatized that he ultimately committed suicide. He never got over it. And he had also been a student at the university. They didn't say anything. Then-Governor Exon said nothing. Nobody did. I did. So when I hear these emotional appeals made on the floor, I can understand. But it's not going to sway me at all. I still don't trust the military. And I do not want a sliding scale, where a determination can be made by some National Guard bureaucrat--and that's what they are most of the time, because they are not engaged in active military service as we apprehend active duty. If they were on active duty, they'd be under federal control. If Senator Schimek remembers--and I don't know that she was irritated at me last session and other times when I spoke on it--I was the one who condemned sending anybody to Iraq. And I was the one who insisted that we be trying to bring them all back home so you wouldn't have those kind of situations Senator Schimek is talking about. You wouldn't have had people leaving home. You wouldn't have had people coming back in body bags. But it's so easy to say, let's give some tuition money, and don't criticize the National Guard. I'll criticize anybody I think I ought to criticize. And just because the ministers in this state won't speak out as a whole, organizations won't speak out, politicians won't speak out, that doesn't set the standard for myself. I
