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said one person dying is too many. And if some of you would read, you would know that George Bush the first had written a book explaining why he did not go into Iraq to pursue Saddam. He said, first of all--and this may not be the order--if you overthrow him, you might have something far worse. America would have to invade and stay there. There would be an untold number of casualties which nobody can predict at this time. The expenditures of money and materiel, it's all too costly. It's not worth it. So his son read that, and everyplace where daddy put a negative, junior put an affirmative. So he said, you should go into Iraq, you should overthrow Saddam, you should have a lot of casualties, you should spend billions of dollars, you should get stuck in a quagmire for a period of time that nobody can determine. I'm going to criticize, and I will not refrain because people don't like what I say. I don't like this bill, so I'm fighting against the bill. I don't like giving these tuition credits and allow them to go to private, independent, not-for-profit institutions. So what do I do? Oh, I rail. But I also offer amendments. And if the amendments are not accepted here, when we get to the A bill I'll fight the A bill. And if the A bill is accepted, I will try to cut an equal amount of money from the budget.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And when we get to the budget, we're toward the end of the session, and people are going to be cranky. Their nerves are going to be bad. And they're going to tell me, Ernie, don't...this piddling amount, don't even take our time for it. I say, then give me what I want; give me the piddling amount cut from the budget and I'll let you have your way, provided no other issues arise that I feel need my particular attention. I still am in opposition to what Senator Thompson is proposing. I still am in opposition to what Senator Janssen's bill would try to do by way of setting a policy; namely, that because somebody is in the National Guard they're entitled to these tuition waivers or credits. I'm not for that. These people didn't join the National Guard and...I don't know what they told Senator Schimek and these other people. They didn't join the National Guard so they could go fight. They didn't join the National Guard with the expectation of being on active
