SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, would you yield to a question, Senator Janssen, from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, how are you going to figure out what your A bill should be, when you don't have any idea how many people are going to go to school, other than the maximum number who are allowed, and you don't know what percentage of tuition...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...will be allowed, up to 100 percent? What is going to be the basis for you fashioning an A bill?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, we'll take the amount of people that are enrolled right now, and figure that out at 100 percent, and go with that, the enrollment we have right now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then there could be people who would not be...there wouldn't be any money available for others, based on that. Because not everybody in the National Guard is enrolled right now. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, you'd have to start somewhere. And it would probably grow from there, possibly, you know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Or you...with the situation the way it is now, Senator Chambers, I'm not too sure that some people in the Guard would want to reenlist. You know, this could happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So...

SENATOR JANSSEN: So the numbers I doubt would...hopefully, they'd stay the same. Because they...you know, they like to be at the strength of where they're at.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But in the second that might be remaining,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.
