SENATOR CHAMBERS: Even though right now they only receive 75 percent.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, did you wish to use the rest of your time? You have 30 seconds left.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, I don't believe so. (Laugh) I'll give the 30 seconds back to you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, your light is next. You may continue, if you care to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this my third time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you mind if I read some guests of Senator Stuhr?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No. Mr. President, this is your house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Appreciate your consideration. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion. Senator Chambers. And thank you for letting us announce that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, Mr. President, always. I'm happy to be obliging. (Laugh) And I want the tyrant to understand that. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, my colleagues are probably growing weary. Now, this is only about the 13th day of the session. We've got 77 days to go, and you're tired already? Some people told me we've been here more than 13 days. Do you see that when you're having fun, time...maybe I'm not having fun, but time is not flying for me. I'm enjoying the session. But imagine how you're going to feel 20 days from now, 30 days from now, 40 days from now if, on a bill like this, you're wearied, you cannot engage your mind with this bill. But there are important issues before us here. Now, Senator Janssen could end all this by telling me he'll withdraw his bill, which he's
