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setting a tone, even though some people may not perceive what that tone is. But I'm watching very carefully. I'm listening to what everybody is saying. And this bill has been something like a sounding board. If the body is going to move this bill in the condition that it's in, then I know I'm absolutely correct when I say, either you haven't read it or you don't understand it. In either case, you play into my hands. Ignorance is what I can deal with, because most people in this society, unfortunately, fit into that category. They're uninformed; they're misinformed. And they are lazy and will not read these bills, will not inform themselves. They'll look to see how certain people may be voting, and that's the way they vote. At this point, it makes not too much difference. But as we get deeper into the session, it's going to make a lot of difference, because you're casting votes now, and a pattern will be established. So I can use this bill for a number of purposes. But Senator Janssen is such a kindhearted person, he deserves to get a vote on this bill to advance it. And I'm going to make sure that I don't do anything to stop him from getting that vote. Is this my third time speaking, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is your second, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: My second. I'll speak just one more time, because I don't think anybody else is interested. And then Senator Janssen can get his vote, and then he can tell the National Guard people that he rescued them. They'll say, what did you give us? He'll say, well, I took away the guaranteed 75 percent, and you might get 100 percent, but again, you might get nothing. And they'll say, with that kind of help, I'm not sure whether I've been helped or not. So they'll think about that. You all won't think about it, and I hope you don't think about it. But we'll just see how things play out from this point on. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, did you wish to speak?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Mr. President, members of the
