SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: And so I appreciate the fact, in my private conversations with Senator Schimek and Senator Janssen, about what they're going to work on in-between here, because it does have a lot of implications. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Seeing no further lights on, Senator Janssen, you may close, if you care to.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Well, we've spent the morning on this particular bill. And thank you, Senator Chambers, for allowing us to discuss this very extensively. It's always my pleasure to be with you or against you. It's always a thrill, no matter which side you're on. But I believe we have...we've made some changes. Yes, we have. There have to...there will certainly have to be a little more adjusting on this bill, especially on the finances of it, how and that...and how that will transpire. With that, I believe that we've got something we can begin to work with. And I would appreciate a vote of...a yes vote on this to move it over to Select File. And between now and then Senator Pederson, Senator Schimek and I will work on the financing of the bill. Thank you.
