FLOOR DEBATE

February 17, 2005 LB 21, 119

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: Senator Flood, I have no further amendments to the bill, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Flood, for a motion, please.

SENATOR FLOOD: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 119 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 119 to E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Mr. Clerk, LB 21.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 21. Senator, I do have Enrollment and Review amendments, first of all. (AM7002, Legislative Journal page 432.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Flood, for a motion, please.

SENATOR FLOOD: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendment to LB 21.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 21. All in favor of the motion say aye, please. Opposed, nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Senator Erdman would move to amend with AM0082. (Legislative Journal page 402.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman, to open on AM0082 to LB 21.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Flood, you're doing a fantastic job. Members of the Legislature, the amendment to LB 21 is a technical amendment. If you read the actual copy of the bill, the language is quite redundant. The amendment would clarify that, would strike some of the redundancy, and rather reference the previous statute in which the individuals who get a boater safety permit is referenced at. So instead of actually rewriting all of the same language that's in the previous section in the actual state law, we're just
