SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who would like to buy this product because it will have more of a kick, based on the distilled alcohol. Is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, it can only have up to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Forty-nine percent.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, no, it's less than that. It would be the amount of alcohol that's in beer. It couldn't be any more than that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and...

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe it's 6 percent, yeah,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, you mean...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...of alcohol.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...so if you put 49 percent of distilled spirits in this malt liquor, it's going to be considered to have no more than 6 percent alcohol content?

SENATOR JANSSEN: In the mixture, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's like saying I'm going to give you 20 percent for this item, 80 percent for that item, 100 percent for that item, and 120 percent for the other, and it's supposed to add up to 100 percent. Help me to understand this. What constitutes...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...alcohol...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue.
