SENATOR CONNEALY: In beer...in beer there is. I think that some beers are added some distilled alcohol, so...but it's...usually it's a pretty small amount. Most of the beer comes...the beer alcohol comes from distillation (sic), but I think that there's some processes that do add a little bit of distilled alcohol.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean most of it comes from brewing...

SENATOR CONNEALY: Brewing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...currently.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Sorry. Brewing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So somebody decided that putting distilled spirits in beer is going to do something that will make it more attractive to the beer-buying public.

SENATOR CONNEALY: And these...and the way I understand it, these are quite popular products.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why? They don't give more of a kick, you said.

SENATOR CONNEALY: (Laugh) I don't know why because I don't drink them, so I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do they...okay, thanks. I'll ask Senator Janssen. Senator Janssen, may I ask you a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you drink beer?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Not very much.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Once in awhile.
