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SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I guess what I'm really trying to understand is why we in the body should vote for this. Is it just to comply with federal regulations?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I still have difficulty, and I won't ask any more questions, however, on that. And it's interesting what Senator Chambers was saying, and I can buy into part of that, and particularly when he was questioning who would drink this product. I don't think anybody over 40 years old has ever had one of these. It is a product for young people. Senator Cornett, I don't know what your age is and so I'm not going to inquire either.

SENATOR CORNETT: (Microphone malfunction)... (inaudible).

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh) But anyway, maybe it is that nobody over 30 would drink these products, but it is a product for young people. And I do have a concern any time that we develop products that would encourage more young people to participate and to drink alcoholic products. And I know it's marketed for young people also, so I do have a concern about that. Now, if this is a bill that needs to identify just how this is to be taxed, I can certainly look at that. But I, like Senator Chambers, really do not want to promote a product that more young people are going to indulge in and indulge in very heavily. I certainly go to the grocery store from time to time and see young people and what they're carrying out of the store, and I do know that some of these products are being used, and being used very heavily, and some of the parties that young people have, underage individuals, it is also present. So I will be glad to listen to the testimony and if there's a reason taxwise that this should pass, I could...I could support that. But if it's just to make this product more attractive to young people, I'll certainly be opposing it. Thank you, Mr. President.
