So here's what you will find on page 329 of this book, Original Meanings: To prove the absurdity of enumerating rights, federalists lampooned, lampooned one of the amendments proposed by the minority in the Pennsylvania convention. And this is what that silliness would have tried to put in the U.S. Constitution which would have affirmed that Americans would retain the, quote, liberty to foul and hunt in seasonable times and on lands they hold and, in like manner, fish in all navigable waters and others not private property, without being retained. They tried to put a hunting, fishing amendment in the U.S. Constitution, but they had more intelligent people then than they have now, or they had people with a little more moxie than are on the floor of this Legislature. I don't know how they could get 39 people to sign this. Children ought to be given copies of this to show the nature of people who wind up on the floor of this Legislature. Let me read what happened. Nearly transported by laughter, and why could this man that I'm going to read about laugh? Because he knew there was not enough stupidity among those there to give this nonsense a chance of acceptance. Let me continue. Nearly transported by laughter at this clause, Noah Webster proposed a further restriction, quote, that Congress shall never restrain any inhabitant of America from eating and drinking at seasonable times, or prevent his lying on his left side in a long winter's night, or even on his back, when he is fatigued by lying on his right. That's how Noah Webster ridiculed what you're talking about befouling the constitution with today. Why do they not have a pure democracy where the people participate in governing and actually vote? Because it's unwieldy, it's impractical, and the people don't know enough to govern themselves. They have narrow, parochial, individual issues and might not know about anything other than what is in their front yard, their backyard, their side yards, and what goes on in their neighbor's house. So they develop a representative form of so-called democracy where people who are supposed to be intelligent and informed will do the business of governing and represent the best interests of the people, and put words, language and ideas into a constitution that not only detail rights that the people have, responsibilities they are required to assume, rights which the government may not infringe, rights which are inalienable, meaning a person cannot
