SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...an idea of what this government is supposed to be about, the standards that will guide those who become a part of it, and the kind of society which ultimately is to be developed. And hunting, fishing, and trapping would demean, degrade, and trivialize that document, so when it came before them they lampooned it and were almost transported with laughter. Oh, I'll wait until I'm recognized the next time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. On with discussion. Senator Schrock, followed by Senator Kruse, Connealy, and Chambers. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, for the record, we're talking about FA32 right now, and I think Senator Chambers would acknowledge that. I am asking the body to support that, that amendment, and as you read the part of the legislative resolution or constitutional amendment we have here, it shall add the words "are deemed to be." It presently reads, "Fishing, trapping, and hunting are a valued part of the heritage of the people and will be a right forever preserved for the people subject to reasonable restrictions as prescribed by law." With Senator Chambers' amendment, it will read: Fishing, trapping, and hunting are "deemed to be" a valued part of the heritage of the people and will be a right forever preserved for the people subject to reasonable restrictions or...as prescribed by law. And so I will support that part, that constitutional amendment. Senator Chambers, I haven't looked at all the rest of them, but I presume the rest of them maybe will be ones I will oppose. Somebody says we aren't under threat now, this isn't an issue. There are organizations out there that it kind of can become an ag and an animal confinement issue also. There are organizations out there that want to change the way we do business. You say it's not a problem. Well, in California, they have banned mountain lion hunting. That was done by a referendum of the people. And guess what. Mountain lions are
