You all, who have never had a history of being enslaved, don't understand at all what I'm talking about. It's fun to you to go out and kill these helpless things that harm you in no way. I tell you again, I worked to craft the amendment that would let them kill these feral pigs because I was shown the danger that they pose, but animals often pose a danger to human beings because human beings encroach on their habitat. The animals don't come where humans are. Most animals fear humans and will run from them. You know the animals that don't fear human beings? The ones that come around human beings and take on human beings' ways. And some of those will kill...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because they can. They will take down animals that they cannot eat. They take on the worst attributes of human beings. Human beings need to learn something by watching nature and not always want to kill it. You know what the people who support this amendment would like to do? see a beautiful, majestic mountain sheep. They say, good God, what a beauty of nature, (qunshot sound) I got to kill it, I got to have his horn, I got to have his head stuck on my wall, and I want my children to come here so they'll go out and kill them And that ennobles them. That brings them closer to God. too. That makes them appreciate nature. And this final because I know you're going to support this amendment of mine, the first amendment I offer is agreed to by Senator Schrock because it improves on the work of that genius up in Minneapolis who wrote the thing that you all are voting on. And my first amendment is going to improve it and you're asked to adopt the amendment. I don't care whether you adopt any of mine or not. Thank you, Mr. President.
