SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COMBS: ...and welcome the opportunity to continue to talk about hunting and trapping and fishing, and participating in the debate on it. I would like to say that it is a significant impetus to our economy. The book that was passed out, I won't read it just yet, but there are millions of dollars, over \$200 million that does flow into our economy as a result of people coming here to do just that, and we want to protect that and I do believe that it would pass overwhelmingly if presented before the people in the form of a constitutional amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Combs. On with discussion of the reconsideration motion. Senator Friend, followed by Senator Schrock and Chambers.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, if you're listening somewhere out there, most...yeah, I see Senator Heidemann waving. Great. (Laugh) Fourteen minutes till what Senator Chambers really refers to as Captain Lunch-Hunter. The reconsider motion? I quess, sure, why not? Senator Chambers' amendment, FA32, I might vote no on it now. LR 8CA, you know, where's the passion? Napoleon was a guy. Remember I brought this up a few weeks ago? Napoleon was Between 1807, for the most part, and 1814, he pretty much ravaged Europe and he ravaged it, as I look at my...as I look at the Chamber Viewer, much in the same way Senator Chambers is ravaging this amendment. The funny thing about it is Napoleon's marshals were good but they weren't great, and when they were on their own they were susceptible to problems. The French were...when Napoleon was ruling the world, the world was absolutely terrorized by Napoleon. But if he wasn't there, they knew it and then they were suspect, and then they got...then they got beat, in Spain, for example. The French Corps did not liberate Spain. They didn't have a great supply line. They didn't have people coming in to support them the way our...the way historically the United States has waged...been involved in battle and waged war against our enemies, the Germans even, things like that in World War II.
