regional zoning because there's really not any authority within the commission to do anything, and it was really to study regional zoning, and we are now changing that to say county zoning within the opportunity zone, so that if there were...if there is a unique area, that you could have some sort of a consistent policy for zoning. It might mean...this was never meant to add another hurdle or take back...take away any power of the counties to make appropriate zoning regulations, but to make some...there might be a designation of areas in which there would be a consistency of zoning and there would be a one-stop shop for how...for the location of businesses and who they would operate with if they were looking at locating at different sites along the opportunity zone. And then the second thing that I talked about, which is the inclusion of one representative from a city of the first class, and one representative from a city of the second class or a village.
